POLICY: Bile Acid Sequestrants Step Therapy Policy

- Questran®, Questran® Light, Prevalite® (cholestyramine oral suspension Par, Upsher Smith, generic)
- Colestid® (Colestipol oral suspension and micronized tablets Pfizer, generic)
- Welchol® (colesevelam tablets and oral suspension Cosette, generic)

OVERVIEW

Cholestyramine is indicated for use as adjunctive therapy for the **lowering of serum cholesterol** in patients with primary hypercholesterolemia who have not responded to diet or other measures alone. Colestipol is indicated as adjunctive therapy to diet for the **reduction of elevated serum total and low-density lipoprotein cholesterol (LDL-C)** in patients with primary hypercholesterolemia (elevated LDL-C) who do not respond adequately to diet. Colesevelam is indicated as an adjunct to diet and exercise to **reduce elevated LDL-C** in adults with primary hyperlipidemia. Colesevelam is also approved to reduce LDL-C levels in boys and postmenarchal girls, aged 10 to 17 years, with heterozygous familial hypercholesterolemia who are unable to reach LDL-C target levels despite an adequate trial of dietary therapy and lifestyle modification. Colesevelam is also indicated as an adjunct to diet and exercise to improve glycemic control in adults with **type 2 diabetes mellitus**.

POLICY STATEMENT

This program has been developed to encourage the use of a Step 1 Product prior to the use of a Step 2 Product. If the Step Therapy rule is not met for a Step 2 Product at the point of service, coverage will be determined by the Step Therapy criteria below. All approvals are provided for 1 year in duration.

<u>Automation</u>: A patient with a of one Step 1 Product within the 130-day look-back period is excluded from Step Therapy.

- **Step 1:** cholestyramine oral suspension, colestipol oral suspension, colestipol micronized tablets, colesevelam tablets, colesevelam for oral suspension, and Prevalite oral suspension
- **Step 2:** Welchol tablets, Welchol for oral suspension, Questran oral suspension, Questran light oral suspension, Colestid oral suspension, and Colestid micronized tablets

CRITERIA

- 1. If the patient has tried one Step 1 Product, approve a Step 2 Product.
- **2.** No other exceptions are recommended.
